ABOUT THE TOPIC AND THE SEMINAR

Gender gaps exist in nearly all cultural fields in the world and across the member states of the EU. Women are not only underrepresented in the workforce, mainly in creative jobs and in leadership and decision-making positions, but also paid less than their male colleagues. Moreover, gender stereotypes and sexual harassment are still widely taking place, while access of female artists to resources and to the art market is often limited. The conditions on the labour market make women artists particularly vulnerable, in particular as far as labour segregation, social rights related to pregnancy, maternity and pensions are concerned.

Gender Equality is discussed at all levels of society and transversally across sectors both nationally as well as in the EU. The seminar will endeavour to build on existing foundations by drawing on most recent research and activities on the topic.

The European Commission project Voices of Culture had Gender Equality as a topic at a Brainstorming meeting in Prague in September 2019. 35 representatives of European networks, organisations and institutions were selected in an open call to work on the topic and to put forward recommendation on policy, actions and projects to the European Commission and the Open Method of Coordination group (representatives from EU Member States) in a Structured Dialogue that took place in Brussels on 6th and 7th November 2019. The results of this work will be presented at the Tampere seminar on 3rd December by representatives from the Structured Dialogue group. Their work will serve as a point of departure in the discussions in the Tampere seminar.

AIM OF SEMINAR: The aim of the Gender Equality seminar is to raise awareness on gender balance in the cultural and creative sectors at policy, administrative and practical levels and to propose projects ideas and actions that can address the issues.

OUTPUT OF WORKSHOP OF THE SEMINAR: A catalogue of project ideas and actions.

TO WHOM WILL THE SEMINAR BE RELEVANT: Policy makers at EU, national, regional and municipal levels, cultural and other networks, NGO's, institutions, organisations and foundations interested in and/or working with the topic and European Capital of Culture cities (applicants, past and present ECoCs).
