Tables	Cities	Title	Description
1	NetZeroCities	Climate Neutral Cities, the Mission & NetZeroCities	The session will focus on climate neutrality in cities, the 100 Climate Neutral and Smart Cities Mission, and NetZeroCities. It will focus on the support available to cities and open a discussion on the support cities need for their climate neutral journey.
2	Lublin	Lublin European Youth Capital 2023 - creation and development of youth participation in times of crisis	The aim of the European Youth Capital is to strengthen the position of young people, increase their participation in decision-making and strengthen the European identity, but also build the involvement of city dwellers based on the energy and activity of young people.
3	Mezitili	Regenerating the Nature with volunteers	We are running a project with volunteers for producing biodegradable food for nature.
4	Oulu	Climate education in a new way?	We've started another project called Ilmastolukiot (Climate Upper Secondary Schools) which will continue the climate action in 10 upper secondary schools during the school year 2021-2022. With these schools we will test and develop materials during the next year, but all the materials are still open to all.
			We think the whole school as a learning environment for climate action: we explore our school, make climate actions as a community and concentrate on reducing CO2 emissions. From talk to action and from individual to community!
5	Munich	The power of community	The growing tech community in Munich consists of over 5,000 members, coming from leading corporations, small and medium-sized enterprises and individuals of students and volunteers from over 60 nationalities. ReDI offers digital courses and workshops to beginners and advanced learners between 11 and 60+ years.
6	Espoo	Citizen engagement in the climate work	Come and share best practices on how to best engage citizens and create possibilities for them to act in the climate neutrality work in cities. Espoo will share some examples of the current work in the area, such as the newly starting Resident Partner Group of Sustainable Development
7	The Hague	Electric car-sharing cooperatives	The local project 'Electric car-sharing cooperatives in The Hague' promotes car-sharing both commercially and cooperatively, as a solution for business and civic community to choose more sustainable forms of mobility such as cycling in the city of The Hague. Creating space in busy urban areas by scaling up electric car-sharing cooperatives, for example in the 'Bomenbuurt' district in The Hague.
8	Helsinki	Ethics and the Smart City	Presentation of the ongoing work to define and implement practices for ethical practices in data and AI at the city of Helsinki.
7	IURC	International Urban and Regional Cooperation	Discuss how city-to-city cooperation with partners across Asia, Latin America and North America is boosting energy and digital transition and helping in achieving climate neutrality goals.
10	Espoo	Espoo Digital agenda	Residents and customers expect services that are independent of time, place and language. The digitalisation of services and new technologies can make everyday life easier.

1	Guimaraes	Guimarães 2030: built by citizens	Permanence is the keyword for sustainable strategies. What you should know about your citizens that you could be used to transform your city into a carbon-neutral city. We will showcase our strategy in force since 2013.
2	Grenoble-Alpes Metropole	European green capital 2022: 12 themes, 50 challenges and hundreds of actions	Grenoble-Alpes Metropole, as European Green Capital 2022, took the initiative to create 50 challenges (in 12 areas) allowing local governments, private companies, NGOs, groups of people or individuals to propose actions amplifying carbon neutrality for a more liveable and sustainable territory.
3	Budapest	Solar Powered: Removing obstacles to solar capacity expansion in Budapest	The session will present the Budapest – Solar Powered project which aims to eliminate the obstacles that lie in the way of large-scale solar capacity expansion in Budapest.
4	Dresden	Integrated Strategies for Sustainable Development in 'Climate Neutral and Smart Cities'	Dresden is one of the "100 Climate neutral and smart cities" chosen by the European Commission. To reach that goal, cities need to develop integrated policies and strategies for sustainable development in different and sometimes conflicting policy areas. We would like to network and learn from each other with colleagues of member cities where such integrated strategic processes are either already implemented or will be implemented.
5	Zaragoza	Accelerating the ecological transformation of the cities of the future	Ecological measures that help to accelerate the transformation of the cities towards climate neutrality. Ongoing projects of Zaragoza City, highlighting the importance of the project "Citizen Forest of Zaragoza".
6	Espoo	UN Agenda 2030 and SDGs	How to drive SDG governance forward in our cities and communities.
9	Mayors' Alliance	Mayors Alliance for the Green Deal - what's next	The Mayors Alliance is a Eurocities campaign to profile cities and mayors in the implementation of the Green Deal. This session will discuss advocacy and public communication actions, to be delivered in partnerships with cities, to keep the Green Deal on top of the political agenda.
8	Frankfurt	100 climate-neutral and smart cities by 2030	Frankfurt am Main was elected to be one of 100 climate neutral cities. Already 2012, when Frankfurt am Main was selected by the federal government as a so-called "master plan 100% climate protection municipality" to provide the blueprint for the energy transition at the federal level. Frankfurt am Main looks forward to working closely with cities that are pursuing the same goals as we do.
9	Green City Accord	Climate-neutral cities: The Green City Accord as a framework to support and enhance your climate ambitions	The Green City Accord is a DG Environment led initiative where your city is committing to improving the living conditions of its citizens in five core areas. These are air quality, biodiversity, water, circular waste management & noise pollution. The initiative gives you a framework to strengthen your climate neutrality ambitions with dedicated events, peer learning, and best-practice sharing among the network, as well as direct exchange with DG Environment staff.
